A City University

Prague City University is located in and inspired by one of Europe's great capital cities. In our 20th anniversary year, we will embark on another exciting phase of development with the opening of a custom-designed main campus in the creative district of Pragovka.

Pragovka Campus

In our 20th year, we begin our most ambitious project yet, as we take residency at our new campus in the fully-reconstructed E-Factory. For several years we've had a dedicated studio space for MA Fine Art students there so we look forward to consolidating the schools and programmes into this custom-built campus.

The Pragovka Art District is a transformative project that features historically significant industrial buildings converted into sustainable, energy efficient studios, start-ups, incubators and traditional office and classroom spaces. These will sit alongside newly built housing connected by green, public-friendly open spaces. The E Factory - built between 1930–1933 by architect Josef Kalous - is the beating heart of Pragovka and is the main entry point to the district.

Pragovka is a short walk from the Kolbenova and Vysočanská metro stations and tram stops, and in the future it will be fully integrated into the nearby cycle path network.

The district has actively pursued a rich tenancy mix to grow a collaborative and creative community. As the sole education partner in the project, PCU is central to the developer's vision of art studios and professinal businesses. The aim is to create synergy through information exchange, shared resources and a rich programme of activities and events, alongside essential retail such as restaurants, bars, cafes and groceries. In the near future, the district will also include a Student Housing development just 20 metres from the campus front door, and many apartment developments in the nearby environs.



City Centre Campus

PCU's City Centre Campus is in the centre of Prague, within the Hybernská Centrum building, directly opposite the Masaryk railway station and Náměstí Republiky metro line. The campus is located in a dynamic business quarter that is undergoing swift urban development and renewal.

At its heart is Masaryčka, a prestigious new building designed by the renowned Iraqi-British architect Zaha Hadid, before her death. The district houses global businesses alongside public-friendly green spaces, numerous cafes, hotels, restaurants, study spaces and galleries surrounding the railway station.

Our campus features tall ceilings, wide corridors and classrooms that are spacious, well-ventilated and bright. The prime location is beneficial for working students and allows us to be closer to our industry partners.

We make full use of our location and facilities by organising and hosting alumni gatherings, public conferences and industry events.



City Living

Living in a capital city is an exciting prospect, and we appreciate the need to feel secure and comfortable. That's why we cooperate with trusted student residence providers who offer a wide range of quality accommodation in central locations. We help facilitate the process so that students moving to Prague can travel with confidence, knowing that their accommodation is ready and waiting.

Our primary residential provider is Student House Botič who have been welcoming PCU students for many years. The residences are full of students just like you, so it's easier to make friends and integrate into your new city. In addition, we have secondary options through connections with other providers and associations for independent living in central locations.

We take advantage of this central location and undertake co-curricular and extracurricular activities, to explore and engage in the local region and beyond. 

Research, practice and artistic production

Universities are more than teaching and learning. They are places where new ideas are generated, arguments formulated and complex questions debated. In turn, these ideas find their way into creative projects and research, enriching the educational experience.

Many lecturers are engaged in ongoing research projects to find answers and solutions under the framework of the United Nations Sustainable Development goals (SDG) to support and advance businesses and economies, leading to a healthier and more equitable future for society.

Their work is supported by educational and governmental grants and several faculty are members of the editorial boards of international journals regularly indexed in Scopus and Web of Science (WoS) databases.

Students benefit from being taught by faculty members who have established reputations as writers and researchers. Their work influences and inspires students to embrace and implement this new thinking into their studies, workplaces and careers.

Joint Research Seminar Series

initiated in 2021, the scientific seminar series with Teesside University International Business School is a platform for faculty members to engage in research and sharing of ideas.

Publications

Faculty have authored a number of papers in areas such as mathematics, cognitive science, software engineering, performance and visual culture, intellectual capital, corporate transparency, sustainable finance, corporate governance and banking that are published and indexed in Scopus and WoS databases. The School of Education faculty research has been published in prestigious Czech and international periodicals such as Slovo a slovesnost, SALi, Naše řeč, Pedagogická orientace, Časopis pro slovanskou filologii, Slavie, The Journal of Culture, and Multilingual.



Participation in International Conferences

Faculty research work is presented and faculty regularly moderate at international research groups and conferences.

CSR project with Unibail-Rodamco-Westfield (URW)

Partnering with URW since 2021, the School of Business faculty has developed and delivered a customized business skills programme in Czech for long-term unemployed people.

Future of Art and Design

The faculty members of the School of Art & Design took part in a seminar organized by students to talk about the future of Art & Design in Central Europe after the pandemic. The panelists included not only teachers but also respected art professionals who work and exhibit their artwork in Europe and other countries.

Teaching English as a second language

The School of Education conducts research into Teaching English as a second language under the framework of various programmes such as GAČR (the Czech Science Foundation), EU structural programmes and programmes for further education run by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports (MŠMT) which can be found on their website.



Centre for Research and Interdisciplinary Studies

School research and activities outside of the classroom fall under the umbrella of the University's Centre for Research and Interdisciplinary Studies (CRIS). CRIS is responsible for arranging conferences and seminars.

CRIS is divided into four research and development units that align with the faculties of PCU: the School of Business, the School of Art & Design, the School of Media & IT, and the School of Education. Each unit has a designated research lead selected by the Faculty to oversee and coordinate research efforts. These leads are responsible for organising collaborative projects between schools and external partners in various areas such as conferences, publications, and other activities.

Education Beyond the Classroom

PCU introduces students to additional areas of study, research and support for their personal and professional interests. Furthermore. PCU's expanding international network of professional and academic partners ensures that students have ample opportunity to partake in study abroad and work experiences.

Student Associations and Societies

Students can participate in PCU's Student Council, or other student-run societies such as the film, music and gaming societies, or set up their own.

Student Ambassadors

Students can develop their leadership skills by taking on an ambassador role within the university, as for example a digital content creator or a student representative working with prospective PCU students.



The City as a Classroom

PCU offers a free course on Prague architecture including guided tours of the city. This course not only familiarises students with Prague but also highlights the city's development through its remaining buildings, streets and fortifications. Moreover, students gain knowledge about different architectural styles and decorative elements that represent specific time periods. They also discover fascinating stories about influential figures from the past who have played a significant role in shaping this incredibly vibrant city.

Research Opportunities

PCU's Schools encourage faculty and student research, collaboration and discussion, the best of which is published in the Centre for Research and Interdisciplinary Studies (CRIS) bulletin. In addition, students and faculty work with a broad range of universities on research work, international conferences and seminars.

Business Plus

Our university, a member of professional associations and international Chambers of Commerce in the Czech Republic, selects students to participate in business briefings, working committees, presentations and other events. Students at both Master's and Bachelor's level have enjoyed the opportunity to network and learn directly from leaders.

Education Partners

As a participating Erasmus+ university and with a global network of education partners, there are possibilities for students to take a short course or spend a semester abroad. PCU lecturers also undertake academic mobility experiences in partner universities and institutions, bringing back fresh perspectives to share with students and new ideas for Faculty research. In turn, our partners bring their students and faculty to PCU for lectures, workshops and summer programmes.

Professional Partners

Our extensive professional network provides students with numerous work and internship opportunities. Furthermore, partners are invited to conduct professional workshops or appear as guest speakers. Partners have also offered short term roles to students who wish to assist and work in professional roles at local theatre, art and film festivals. Additionally, students work on case study assignments for major corporations such as Coca-Cola and have the opportunity to present their results and findings to management.

Living Futures

Living Futures is our long-term initiative to build awareness of the most important challenges affecting humanity, and our personal roles in shaping society in the future. The activities and initiatives of Living Futures draw inspiration from our core values to inspire action that supports a socially just, ecologically sustainable and culturally rich society. This manifests through an annual theme which is selected each year by faculty and staff based on current world events and issues.





Support Services

Students are supported throughout their academic journey. It starts with a dedicated Admissions Advisor who helps guide applicants through their enrollment, including finding accommodation and applying for a visa if necessary. Once at PCU, students have a dedicated Student Support Advisor for guidance and mentoring as part of our wellbeing programme.



Student Services organise Welcome Days for new students to help them adjust to university life and in many cases, their new city. Social activities, city walks, meeting staff and lecturers and practical sessions help students adjust, feel at home and form friendships across the schools.

PCU offers a wide range of student-led societies, such as the Student Council, International Students Association, Sports Club, Photography Club, Fashion Society, Clay Society and more. These societies are highly active and regularly host events both on campus and off-campus.

The university is a welcoming community that embraces everyone, regardless of their race, religion, sexual orientation, or background. We also assist students who have particular requirements or concerns by connecting them with external organisations that offer assistance and resources.

As part of this commitment, we offer well-being events on-campus as well as free professional psychological counselling through our partnership with City Practice, a local independent service provider.

Career Support

The programme, also available in blended format (kombinované studium), specializes in English and the disciplines related to communication in this language, as well as linguo-didactic training and teaching practice.

In addition, we offer a professional qualification accredited by the Czech Ministry of Education (MŠMT) as part of the Further Education of Teachers project (DVPP). This programme enables applicants with any Master's degree to gain theoretical and practical experience to teach foreign languages at Czech primary and secondary schools.

Accreditation in the Czech Republic

In 2021, we introduced our School of Education, offering a Czech Bachelor's degree. The programme is accredited by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports (MŠMT).

Education Partners

We are committed to developing and expanding our network of close educational partners to provide opportunities for study exchange at PCU and vice versa. Participation in the Erasmus+ programme, for example, is integral to the realisation of this aim.

In addition, by developing high quality international partnerships, PCU can facilitate teacher training, staff mobility, joint research projects and publications.

PCU is also a member of the Council of International Schools (CIS), an organisation which connects us to like-minded universities and high schools across the globe. Participation keeps our staff and lecturers up to date on current sector issues, and the opportunity to share best practice in helping our students successfuly transition from high school to university.

Admissions & Entry Requirements

You will have a dedicated Admissions Advisor to assist you. Whether it's an in-person or online meeting, they will provide guidance all through your application process.

When you are ready to apply, your admission can be completed online, including the submission of supporting documents. There is **no application fee** nor entrance examination.

Once your documents have been reviewed and approved by the Admissions Team, you will be invited for a final interview with your Programme Leader either in person, or online. This interview allows us to further assess your suitability and gives you greater insight into your programme.

When to apply

We have a rolling admission policy. This means that if you are successful in your application and a place is available on your chosen programme, an offer will be made to you! This means you usually know the result within 1 to 2 weeks from the time of application.

We have recommended deadlines to guarantee your place and preferred start semester, and these differ depending on whether or not you need a visa to study with us. The earlier you submit your application to study, the more benefits there are. As our class sizes and groups are small and generally fill up early, we encourage you to apply as early as possible and pay attention to the deadlines.

If your original documents are not in the English language, we ask you to submit the original accompanied with a notarized English translation.

For applicants to British-accredited programmes we do not require your documents (high school diploma or Bachelor's degree) to be legalized by the Czech authorities in the process known as nostrification.

Scholarships and Financing

Applicants for **full-time or distance learning programmes** at Prague City University are eligible to apply for a scholarship covering up to 50% of tuition fees. Scholarships can be awarded for either a single academic year or the duration of the programme.

The Academic Excellence Scholarship

is for outstanding academic achievement and/or engagement in an academic context. We also offer an **Academic Excellence Graduate Scholarship** which is awarded to all PCU Bachelor's degree graduates who decide to continue onto a Master's degree with us.

The Social Engagement Scholarship

is awarded for voluntary or extracurricular activities, or more generally for positive community engagement in society. At the Master's level, we also take into consideration the applicant's professional experience and contributions in the workplace.

The Professional Excellence and Social Entrepreneurship Award for Distance Learning students looks primarily for exceptional achievement in a professional and social context, as well as leadership and entrepreneurial

skills. Evidence from the fields of business, IT or humanitarian engagement will be recognised.

The Dean's Fellowship Award

Newly introduced for 2024, the Dean of each School will be able to nominate exceptional applicants to receive this prestigious award. Covering 50% of recipients' tuition fees, they will have the opportunity to fully immerse themselves into the School taking part in different activities appropriate to their field and level of study.

Support for local students

We have a special fund to support students coming from Czech-language and Slovak-language secondary schools and universities to help ensure attaining a degree at PCU is achievable. Applicants to the School of Education may also be eligible for a grant.

In addition, PCU has supported Ukrainian students under temporary protection in the Czech Republic to continue or start their studies.

Industry Network discount

If you work for a company which is part of our Industry Network, you qualify for an automatic 10% discount, regardless of whether you or your company are paying the tuition. Please get in touch with our Admissions Team to inquire about your eligibility according to your workplace organisation.

Bursary for Professional students

If you are employed by a company which agrees to contribute towards your distance or postgraduate studies, Prague City University will match a contribution from your employer, up to 20% of the total tuition fee.
