### Bachelor's in Education: Teaching English as a Foreign Language

Our programme integrates English as a foreign language study with essential educational, psychological and linguistic components of teacher training. Students develop advanced English skills, with a focus on cultural and linguistic differences across English-speaking countries. You can choose from two pathways: one in English and one in Czech-English for the first year of theoretical studies. In years two and three, both paths merge, with instruction fully in English, allowing Czech-pathway students to learn alongside international peers and absorb regional linguistic differences.

### Benefits for local students & certificate holders

Applicants with CAE or CPE certificates are exempt from the practical language examination when applying and will also earn study credits towards their Bachelor's degree.

Generous scholarships and grants are also available for Czech and Slovak students who have completed the Maturita exam or are teaching in local schools, significantly reducing tuition fees. See website for details.
